Indonesia-backed bloc to win 9 seats Senators from Malaysia's ruling coalition will win nine seats in the race for the 16-member upper house of parliament. The first list of candidates from the Liberal Party (PBB) and the Democratic Action Party (DAP) was released by the Central Election Commission on Monday. Beside the nine elected senators, the three other positions will be filled by three other senators and four representatives from the people's assembly. The seats will be decided in nine constituencies in Java and the central Sumatra island. PBB leader Datuk Seri Najib Razak is expected to win Beruas from the east coast province of West Java. The breakdown is: In West Java, Najib is expected to win Beruas from the east coast province. Two senators will come from Karawang, Riau Islands, the capital city of the province. The third seat is for Jakarta. At least seven seats in North Sumatra will be contested among three lawmakers for the province. Jambi and Lampung have two seats each, and the remaining two are for Riau. According to official information, more than 3,100 candidates and delegates will be approved to become senators. The election will be held in a two-phase process from February 10 to 14 and February 25 to April 17. The recent parliamentary polls has seen a remarkable rise of independents and smaller parties, with the Bersih 3.0 movement garnering the maximum support. An alliance led by Bersih which contains some of the country's civil society and human rights groups, has been active since the rallies in June 2013, when 1,464 people were arrested and more than 100 were injured after mass rallies were held. The acts were condemned as being "tantamount to the arrest and detention of citizens" and "an affront to freedom of expression and freedom of assembly".
